5. Business:

a. Discussion of Proposed Hydraulic Modeling Plan

Minutes:

No discussion at this time on the Hydraulic Modeling Plan as Marty had come across some new information prior to the start of the meeting. Further discussion will happen at a future meeting.

b. Discussion on Proposed Private Well & Retention Basin at 100 Boyson Rd

Minutes:

The owner'of the property at 100 Boyson Rd is inquiring about installing a private well to fill a retention basin that will house a fountain and help in the beautification of the city. This well would also be used to irrigate the property. Representative Brent Jackman from Hall & Hall Engineering was present to answer any questions the board had and relay any questions back to the owner. The Water Department Rules and Regulations state no private well shall be installed within Hiawatha city limits. Allowing a private well would require a rule change. Hiawatha also has a wellhead protection program that would need to be considered. The board agreed before a decision can be made more information would need to be provided. Brent will get more information regarding definite size and depth of the well. Along with information from the well driller on what the impact would be on the nearby well #7 and the underground rock formation.

c. Consider Resolution Authorizing Reimbursement to the City of Hiawatha for Water Main Installation through Turtle Creek Park

Minutes:

Hoffman and Hoffman Trenching Inc of Waterloo lowa will be completing the work for water and sewer installation at Turtle Creek Park. The water portion will be \$50,000.00. The open bunkers will house items such as sand, rock and cold patch. The existing storage building will store infrequently used vehicles and equipment in the heated area. Ruth Hospodarsky made a motion to pass Resolution 12-2023 Authorizing Reimbursement to the City of Hiawatha for Construction of a Cold Storage Building at 1410 Robins Rd with stated amendment of adding budget FY23-24 to the resolution.
