PETITIONS

Jay Schneiders presented comments on Ordinance 2019-16, which is on the Agenda for second reading this evening. The proposed changes to 13-906D should be opposed, because it will not fix important issues. Platting Requirements should be housed in a different section of this Ordinance. This is a critical issue that works with other references throughout this Ordinance and this is not just a simple clean-up bill. Councilor Zotti asked about upcoming recommendations to amend this Ordinance this evening, and how will these recommendations compare to what Mr. Schneiders is discussing. Rick Beckwith, City Attorney, stated that the new City Planner has been reviewing this Ordinance and as it is written, it does not make sense. The City Planner feels that when there are major changes to a P.U.D., it should go through the preliminary development process. Changes that are being requested are not exactly what Mr. Schneiders is suggesting, but will preserve the rights to the preliminary development process. The proposed changes suggest that Platting Requirements be moved from subsection D to subsection E in Section 13-906 of the

Ordinances. Councilor Zotti asked Mr. Schneiders whether this addresses his concerns, and he agreed.

Clark Stith—Representative of House District 48, congratulated Mayor Kaumo and Paul Kauchich for their SLIB Board funding to begin work on the Bitter Creek. Yesterday was the first meeting regarding coal-related bankruptcies, which will address quirks in Wyoming law regarding taxes to avoid being out taxes when companies file for bankruptcy. The idea is to ask for ad valorem taxes to be collected monthly as opposed to semi-annually, which will apply to natural gas, coal, and mining companies.
